The Remotest Parts of the Earth





When you hear about a large group of people coming to Christ, or about sizable evangelistic campaigns, do you ever wonder to yourself what kind of follow-up is being conducted, if at all? Even if the impressive numbers are accurate, won't the impact just fade away over time?



What will keep it from all evaporating?

In the last letter I shared where **Streams of Living Water ministry** is working, and what the vision for the Tyrannus training centers is. This time I would like to give you an idea of the big picture of the ministry so you can see how they are trying to address these natural concerns and build something more solid for God's Kingdom.



Praving

This is where it starts. Streams has over 50 prayer groups throughout Egypt that meet weekly to seek God for the nations. They also host a 3 day intensive prayer retreat every year at a conference center on the Bitter Lakes mentioned in the Bible.



There are currently 8 training centers around the region that provide 10 months of Bible and ministry equipping, followed by a 3 year commitment to planting churches among the least reached in their nations. Right now there are 200 in training.



Church planting

With such response the work of church planting is critical for the discipling of those that come to faith. We currently have 160 full time trained church planters on the field in 4 countries. Over 550 churches have been planted.

Keerwiing

There is a yearly mobilization conference that over 500 young Egyptians attend to hear about what God is doing in the region, and explore what part God might have them play. Usually over a tenth of the whole conference commit to long term missions!

Through the Basics conferences hundreds of young people receive a month of training and then go out to share Christ for a month. In the last two years over 20,000 people have made a decision for Christ through the efforts of these courageous evanglists.

Supporting



Prayer support, field supervision, as well as regular visits by staff care personel is critical to care for all these young national missionaries as they work in some of the hardest places in the world. Some get malaria every month!

See how it all fits together? Every piece is necessary to all the others. And the most amazing part is that the work on the ground is all being done by Middle Easterners with support and encouragement coming from many of us here in the West. Right now I am helping with four of these six areas.

Primer on Sudan

Juba, South Sudan is the location of one of the main Tyrannus Training Centers as well as the House of Hope girls' home. This is where we are going in August. Here is some more information on this needy country.

The World's Newest Country In 2011 South Sudan became independent from North Sudan after decades of civil war.

Religion

Predominantly African cultures who tend to adhere to Christian or animist beliefs. Islam is growing.

Bird Species 831 - Most of any country in the world Official Language English (+ 60 indigenous languages)

Area
About the size of Texas.

Income Most people live on less than a dollar a day.

Hygiene 80% don't have access to a toilet. Poverty

One of the five poorest nations in the world

Literacy

Only 15% - lowest in the world. Only 16% ever go to school.

Transportation
It is estimated that there were only 30 miles of paved roads in the whole country in 2011!

Youngest nation 50% are 18 and younger

Conflict

They have suffered civil wars for about 45 of the last 65 years since 1956. (10 times more than the American Civil War! Over 2 million people died due to war and famine.

Wealth is measured by the number of cattle that each family owns.

National Budget from Oil 98%
