Sermon Title: “A Psalm for All Saints”
(#2 in the Sermon Series)

Scripture text: Psalm 145



Main Points:

1. Everyone’s Life is Singing a Song of Praise
2. The Lord Alone is Worthy of a Psalm of Praise
3. The Life of a Believer Culminates in a Psalm of Praise to the Lord

Questions:

1. Thinking along the lines of a life verse- what psalm, hymn, or worship song would you select as your “life song”?
2. When you consider all of God’s handiwork in your life, what most moves you to erupt into praise?
3. Which scriptures do you most recommend hiding in your heart as a tuning fork to bring your life back into harmony with God’s word?
4. In Psalm 145, verses 4 and 13, David charges Christians with the responsibility to tell future generations about the character and works of the Lord. What are some practical ways in which you are or could do this with those younger than you?
5. Psalm 145, verse 18, speaks of God drawing near to all who call on Him and truth. What would you say to a believer who is crying out to the Lord, yet the Lord seems silent? What would you say to nonbeliever who says they tried Christianity, they tried calling out to the Lord, but it just “didn’t work for them?”
6. According to Psalm 145, verse 10, “all your works shall give thanks” to the Lord. As He has made all things and we are those who know our duty to glorify God, what is our responsibility to our surroundings and our neighbors in shaping and teaching them to do likewise? Are there specific instances you can think of?
